September 29th Advanced Dance


This year, September had five Saturdays, and that meant that the Valley Trailers would sponsor an Advanced dance that evening. The caller was Darrin Gallina, which piqued the interest of some because Darrin isn't normally seen booked to call at this level, and of course Cindy Mower was there to cue the rounds. There were 26 couples with cards for the A1 tips, and 24 for the A2 tips, which worked out quite well because this meant that no one had to sit out for A2, and only two couples sitting out for the A1 tips.

Overall the evening went very well, with everyone seeming to enjoy the dancing. The main problem that seems to come up regularly when cards are used is that people don't understand that when cards are used, they can't just drop

off their card and go home early. The process doesn't work that way. Perhaps what we need to do is go to all open tips at 10:00 when we typically go to all A2 and try to persuade people to stay at least until 10:00.

There were five squares out of the original six still on the floor at 10:00 when it went to all A2, and three squares that stayed for the final "tough stuff" tip, although that one wasn't noticeably harder than the previous ones had been, so if people left before that tip because the "tough stuff" label scared them off, then they missed out on a good tip. It always pays to stay to the end.



Editor Sez

I have commented in this column before about some of the distances we have traveled to go square dancing, but we set a new record for distance for us this past weekend when we went to the Texas Premier Advanced and Challenge Convention, aka TEXPACC. The event was held in Paris, Texas, about 120 miles northeast of Dallas, in the Love Civic Center. This was the 38th year for this event, but apparently this was the first year it was held at this facility after having previously been at the local fairgrounds. Others who had attended previously com-

mented favorably on the new location, and we also thought it was almost perfect for a square dancing weekend with four different levels of dancing going on simultaneously. The only downside was the cement floors, but the surfacing on them made them better than the bare cement floors we have encountered at times. The event was very well coordinated with ample supporting staff and five excellent callers rotating among four different halls from Thursday night through Saturday for a total of 17 hours of dancing. It all ended on Saturday night, leaving Sunday free for those poor souls to get home who had to work on Monday.

We didn't get a count on the total attendance, but there were almost 200 who had pre-registered, more who signed up at the door, and at least one couple who had pre-registered but didn't come, so a guess of 300 people would probably be in the ball park. The pre-registered folks came from Maine and California as well as 18 more states in between those, and Canada and Australia, so while our overall numbers may be on the decline, there are still plenty of en-

thusiastic dancers willing to travel and support dances such as this one.

I am always surprised when we go to these dances quite some distance from home by the number of people we encounter that we know, some from around locally who have also traveled the distance, and probably even more that we have met at these dances who have also traveled considerable distances to attend. It seems that one of the benefits of square dancing that isn't often promoted is the number of friends one makes in the activity. In our case, even as relative newbies to the activity, we have more friends that we have made through square dancing than from other means. Of course this doesn't count the friends who have come and gone over the years due to moves, job changes, etc., just those that we see now on a regular basis, both at dances and at other events. But I think the main reason that square dancing has done this for us is that we get out and go to dances near and far. People who only go to their own club's weekly class, and there seem to

be many in this group, and people who only go to their club's monthly dance, are not going to have the same result that we have had in making new friends. So if you're in either or both of these two groups, you're missing out on many of the benefits that active square dancing has to offer.

Dancing the Seas

The recent Super Square Dance Cruise on the Royal Caribbean “Liberty of the Seas”, headlined by callers Mike Seastrom and Dee Dee Dougherty, brought together 231 dancers, mostly from Texas. The ship’s home port is Galveston, so naturally it would be very easy for Texans to come aboard. The ship has the second largest sea-going dance floor after the Queen Mary. Unfortunately, it was barely able to accommodate all the squares for the first tip. Veteran dancers who have been on previous such cruises must be asking themselves how was it possible to have such a large area. The secret is the conversion of the ship’s ice rink to a dance floor each night. The dancers were charged an extra

\$150 per person for the special service, but it was worth the price, especially for all the round dancers taking advantage of “Waltzing Across Texas” in a ballroom-like setting.

The duet of Mike and Dee Dee brought the highest compliments from among the experienced dancers. The dancers had paid top dollar for this cruise, and were rewarded whenever Mike and Dee Dee took to the stage. The Valley Trailers are very fortunate to have them coming to our stage for the Club’s 64th Anniversary Dance, and you can take advantage of this opportunity without having to go on a cruise for it.




