
Sweethearts

WINTER FESTIVAL SQUARE DANCERS WINTER FESTIVAL ROUNDS SHARDHICKSEY PARYER

38th Annual Winter The Festival took place over the weekend of January 19, 20, and 21 in King City, CA. Valley Trailers' participation was rather limited with only five couples seen there, but this is to be expected for a couple of reasons. For one thing, it always falls on the third weekend of January, which is also the time of our third Saturday dance. Another thing is that it is about a 240 mile drive from Northridge, which understandably discourages many from making the trip. However, those who did make it were rewarded with the skills of some excellent callers. The calling staff was made up of Jerry Story, who announced that this will be his last trip from lowa to this event, Bob Baier from Texas who is the organizer of the event, Eric Henerlau, Michael Kellogg, and Tony Oxendine, an exceptional set of callers from all around the country. The staff for the round dancers was top notch also, consisting of our own Cinda and Milo, and Sharon and Casey Parker. Square dancing was available for Plus, Advanced, and Challenge-1 levels, but only one hall with a wood floor was available, and that went to the Advanced dancers, who apparently had the largest



number of dancers present.

Bob Baier, the organizer for the event, told one small group that this dance has lost money the last three or four years, and as a result he has had to cut back on some features of the weekend to limit his losses. Next year he plans to eliminate Challenge level dancing to help in this regard. The Challenge dancers were understandably disappointed to learn this, but since the maximum number of squares at any one time in their hall was four, it seems like a reasonable action to take. Four squares is hardly going to pay the rent for the additional hall. We didn't get a count on the overall attendance, but a guess of 30 squares would probably be in the ball park. However, it was clear that the future of this long-running and popular event is in jeopardy like so many others that used to draw large crowds of dancers.







Formulas for Success

Have you ever wondered why some square dance clubs are more successful than their nearby counterparts? The Valley Trailers is one of a select group of clubs that have created a formula for success through the years. Each of these clubs has its own unique methods of adding new members to maintain a stable roster.

In the July 2017 issue of Tidbits, the Duke City Singles & Doubles of Albuquerque, NM. were featured for their amazing growth rate each year. Last year, their graduating class produced 38 new club members. The largest square dance club in the US is the Hey Lollies of Houston, Texas. Their schedule of callers for their weekly Thursday night club dances features an impressive parade of some of the best callers in the country, and of course having caller Bob Baier in their organization would be a big plus for any club.

As a follow-up to the article on the success of the Ramblin' Rogues of Mission Viejo, their success comes from their approach to recruiting new students for the September enrollment period.

Throughout the year, club members will invite acquaintances to join the social club, aka the Ramblin' Rogues. Every month there are activities scheduled which have nothing to do with square dancing. But when September comes around, it's square dance time. The same could be said about the Trail Dusters. They acknowledge that they are essentially a social club with square dancing as an ancillary part of their activities. One cannot deny that their formula for success is a tribute to their Board that has parlayed this combination into what their club is today.

Speaking of clubs' boards, the Valley Trailers' year after year achievements are the result of the efforts of the devoted men and women who serve on the VT Board.

Recently Dolva and I have been going to Orange County for the majority of our square dancing. It isn't very convenient because of the distance and the traffic, but we're both retired so have the time to do it; time will tell how long we keep it up. I haven't kept accurate records, but would estimate that we put something over 6,000 miles on the car. most of that on the 405 freeway, and paid about \$1,500 in dance fees from going there in 2017. And this is only for going to Orange County; the dances we went to in places such as Indio, Bakersfield, Los Baños, King City, and likely others that I am forgetting at the moment will increase those numbers quite a bit. But obviously we're enjoying it or we wouldn't keep doing it; we're off to King City again in a week.

At this point, it would be reasonable to ask what is so special about Orange Coun-

ty, why not dance here closer to home, and the answer is that the San Fernando Valley just doesn't offer the kind of dancing, nor the skill level of the dancers, that is available in OC. We have gotten involved a bit in some higher level dancing, and it isn't available here. The only higher level dancing instruction that I am aware of here is three or four one-square tape groups and Buddy Weaver's Wednesday night Advanced class and workshop, which seems to be quite well attended, but is rather low level Advanced dancing through no fault of Buddy's. And we often see members of the tape groups here also going to OC to dance.

So why isn't there more Advanced dancing here? The short answer is that I don't know. However, one contributing factor is that there aren't enough opportunities here now to dance the level to maintain a good degree of proficiency. The only higher level dances here that I am aware of are Buddy's fourth Fridays, Phantoms' second weekend, and the Valley Trailers' fifth Saturdays, and the latter two are doing very well if they can draw five squares. The Phantoms used to run a solid Advanced program, but have backed off from that now. I don't know if this is because the Phantoms' leadership directed this to help maintain the attendance level, or if it was a matter of the callers adjusting to the level of the floor. The problem can't be a shortage of qualified callers; there are several in the relatively local area able to instruct and call at least through A2, and some into the Challenge levels. We see national level callers come to town from time to time to call for local Plus level dances, and they presumably could be scheduled for some higher level dances while they're here. We don't see them here very often, and I don't know how the finances work out, but they apparently do on occasion. I haven't ever looked for a place to hold dances. but considering the number of churches, schools, senior centers, and women's clubs there are in the area, it is hard to believe that a lack of suitable locations is a problem.

So if we have callers and places to dance, all that is left is the dancers. This certainly isn't a significant revelation, because it has been apparent for some time that dancer numbers are on the decline, but this is the crux of the problem. However, this still doesn't explain why the OC area has been able to maintain a viable, albeit not exactly thriving, advanced community, while it has not happened in the SFV. I would rather spend less time driving and less money on gas, and spend that time and money on dancing here at home, but

that seems unlikely to happen, so I'm just hoping that Jerry Brown doesn't add even more taxes to our gasoline.

erything works in our square dance organization. We encourage all of our Mainstream students to attend. We will be giving out a lot of information and it will be a great opportunity to get all of your questions answered.


