


## Fortary Visitation






## Honoring two Presidents

Year after year, presidents Don Krall of the Valley Trailers and Bill Armstrong of the Buckles & Bows have devoted their labor of love to perpetuate their respective square dance clubs' success. What separates these two men from other club presidents is the extent to which they go beyond the established duties and protocols.

One of the many examples of this was when Bill attended a funeral service for a member of the Buckles & Bows. What makes it so special was the scenario of this member. He and his wife had just become members in 2016. They lived in Manhattan Beach and

When we first started dancing, I didn't pay much attention to the star tips; they were just a time to take a break and visit while the majority of the dancers were not out on the floor. But after a while, the challenge of Plus level dancing started to fade and we began looking into Advanced dancing, and now that we have developed some modicum of proficiency there and participate in the star tips, I pay more attention. It seems that there have been some changes in these tips over the past year or so, not necessarily good or bad, just changes. For one thing, there seem to be more dancers participating in the star tips. I seem to remember there being only three or four squares up for them, and often they were scrambling to get enough for a fourth square and not always succeeding. But at our November anniversary dance, there

were seven squares, and at the December dance, there were six. Of course the November dance was a special one since it was our anniversary dance with two popular callers, but it still was drawing mostly from the same local population of dancers. If the number of people doing Advanced dancing is on the increase, that can only be considered to be a good thing for the activity.

Another change I have noticed is that the level of the material being called in these tips seems to be on the decline. Of course part of this may be due to the fact that my perspective is changing as we get more experienced with it, but I'm certain that that isn't all of it. Another factor that may be in play here is that with the increased number of people getting up for these tips, the average level of dancing ability may be declining if the increase in numbers is coming from newer dancers at the level. At our December dance, it seemed that of the six squares dancing, only two of them were doing reasonably well, while the others were breaking down quite a bit, and this in spite of the fact that the level of the material seemed to be unusually easy. Of course there is surely a correlation here between how well the dancers are doing and the level of the material being called. Most callers will bring the level down if they see that much of the floor is having trouble, and this may be a reasonable thing to do, but there is a limit. My recollection of the December star tip is that it was mostly just a typical Plus tip with a few A1 calls mixed in.

Now just to be clear about this, I am not claiming to have identified a problem here, not even a small one. One tip once a month that is going more or less OK now certainly can't be a cause for concern, but if we can make it a little better simply by making a few adjustments, then that must be the right thing to do. My suggestion is that an appropriate person in the Club, probably the president or the caller coordinator who is already in communication with the caller, tell the caller to maintain the level of the material at what was advertised. A1 in the case of our Club, independent of how well the floor is doing. This means that the entire list of A1 calls is fair game, as well as A1 concepts and positioning. Then, if squares are having problems, the caller can take the squares to lines more often than he otherwise might, and the squares that have broken down and presumably have formed lines can resume dancing with essentially no impact on the others. This way the dancers who are able to handle the material can have a fun and more interesting tip, and those who

aren't doing so well still will likely get to dance as much as they did when they were breaking down before but with fewer restart opportunities. At Advanced, and I expect this is true at club level dancing as well, the better callers will only take squares to lines if one or more squares have broken down, so the more experienced dancers will recognize what the caller is doing with this approach, but within reason none of them will object to going to lines several times during the course of a tip. If there are people getting up for the A1 tip who simply can't dance the level, then it doesn't seem fair to penalize the others with a low level tip, especially when some of them may have come because a star tip had been advertised.

I don't recommend this approach for the Mainstream and Plus tips because there the dancers should expect to have a fun, relaxed evening and to be able to do almost everything without problems, but the whole point of dancing at the Advanced level is to be challenged and not get everything. If our Club could develop a reputation for putting on a good, solid star tip, that might well be what it would take to persuade those who might otherwise have been on the fence about going dancing on a Saturday night to come out and join us.

The topic of widely varying dancing abilities among the participants in star tips could easily lead to a discussion about the appropriateness of setting up squares in advance for these tips, but I will leave that as a potential topic for another month.
